## Is this qualification for you?

If you want to train to become a clinical supervisor of counsellors working with clients at service levels A and B, our *Certificate in Therapeutic Counselling Supervision* is the ideal qualification for you.

To benefit from this qualification you should already hold

- › CPCAB's *Level 5 Diploma in Psychotherapeutic Counselling* or *Level 5 Diploma in Cognitive Behavioural Therapeutic Skills and Theory* (or their RPL equivalent) plus one additional year of supervised clinical experience
- › or CPCAB's *Level 4 Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling* (or RPL equivalent) plus two additional years of supervised clinical experience
- › you will also need to have supervisees and be working as a counsellor under supervision.

This qualification requires a minimum of 90 Guided learning hours (GLH) to complete successfully.

## What will I gain from this training?

The *Certificate in Therapeutic Counselling Supervision* will equip you to manage the fundamental aspects of the clinical supervisor's role:

- › providing support and guidance to your supervisees
- › encouraging self review
- › monitoring supervisees' progress
- › managing legal and ethical boundaries
- › developing awareness of the supervision process
- › working with relationship issues which affect the counselling and supervision process
- › exploring research findings on effective supervision.

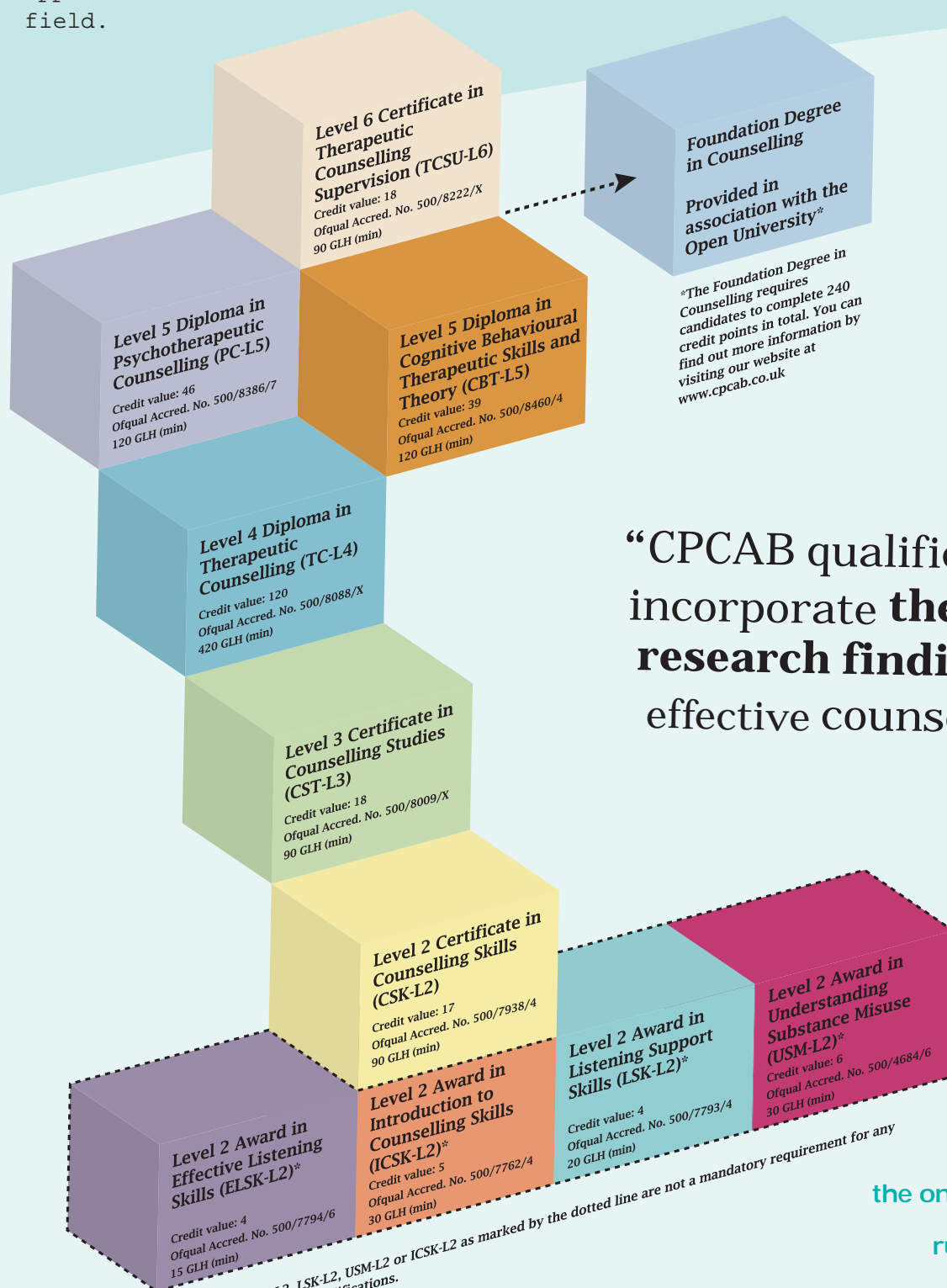
